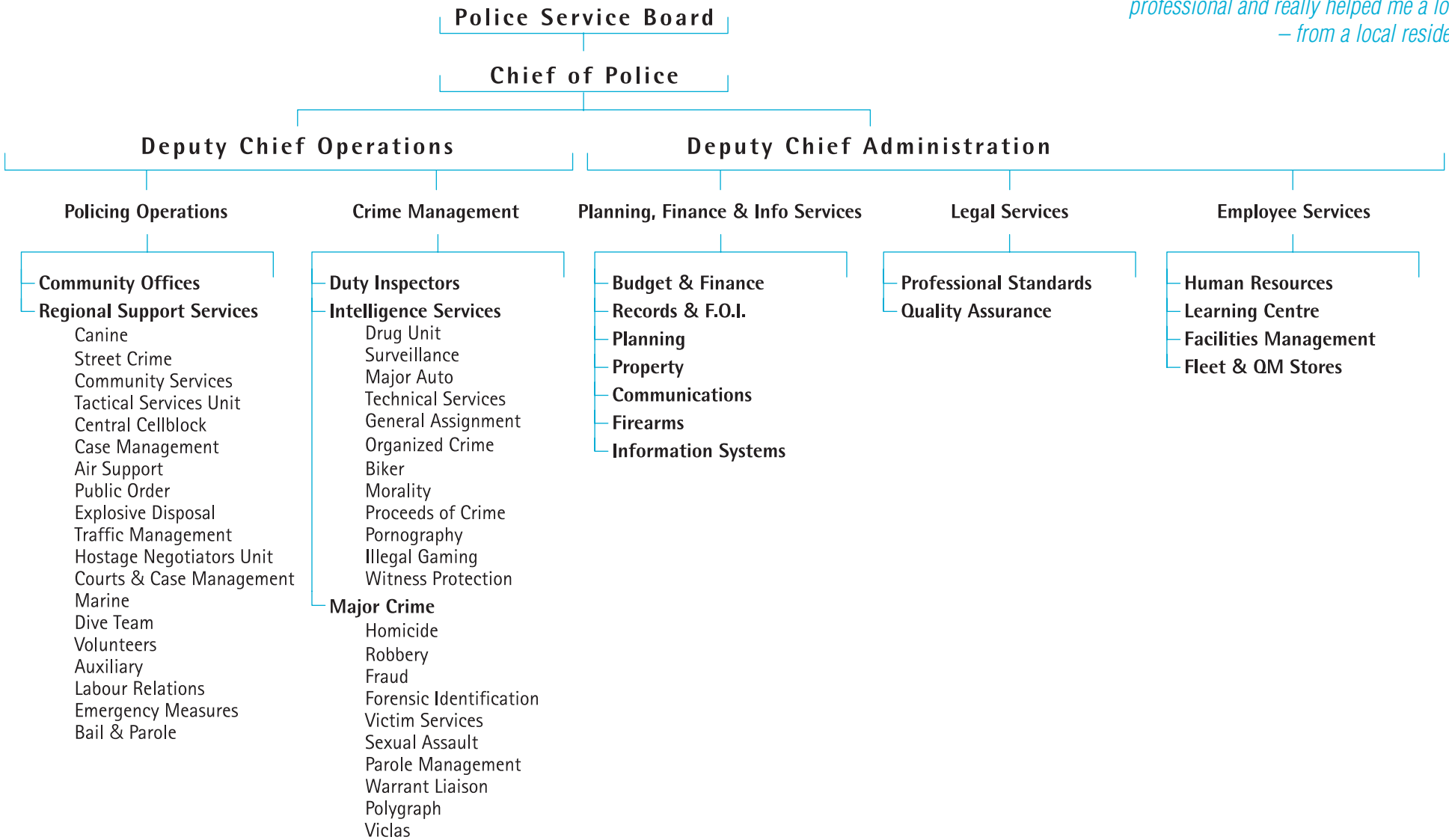


# Organizational Chart

## Performance Objectives

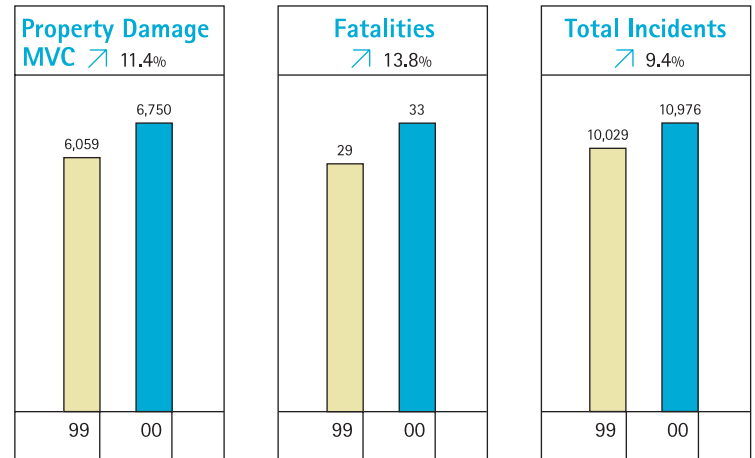
For the Year 2000, the Durham Regional Police Service identified two major objectives: (a) reduce the number of serious injury and fatal traffic accidents and (b) reduce "street level" crime such as break & enter, auto theft, theft and drugs. The following is a summary of how well the DRPS met these objectives:

### Motor Vehicle Collisions Rise

The number of reported motor vehicle collisions (MVC) involving property damage increased by 11.4 per cent and the total number of all driving incidents increased by 9.4 per cent. The total number of fatalities as a result of MVC's increased 13.8 per cent, from 29 in 1999 to 33 in 2000.

The number of MVC personal injuries decreased in 2000, as did the number of persons injured yet the number of people killed and the number of MVC fatalities increased. An increase in the population and aggressive driving have tended to counteract increased policing in these areas and as a result additional resources were added to the Traffic Management Unit in late 2000

### Street Level Crime Down

Durham Region followed the national downward trend in street level crime. Auto thefts decreased by 13.5 per cent; break & enters were down by 7.6 per cent; reported thefts were down 10.5 per cent and reported robberies decreased by 2.4 per cent.
