The Durham Regional Police Service's (DRPS) Youth in Policing (YIP) Initiative is a paid program for Durham youth aged 15-18, providing personal, professional, and community development opportunities. It has been running since 2006 in partnership with Ontario's Ministry of Children, Community, and Social Services (MCCSS), providing 2095 youth employment opportunities to date.

Our mandate is to provide student employment for youth while enhancing relationships between police and the community. Our mission is for all members to be UNITED!

Hiring Details

2023 Summer

The 2023 Summer hiring process ran from March 2023 to April 2023, involving 30 DRPS members.

- YIP received 601 applications and conducted 174 interviews
- YIP employed 100 youth, including 85 Students, 8
 Team Leaders, 4 Supervising Team Leaders, and 3
 Program Coordinators.
- Employment began on July 4, 2023, with Students working 32 hours per week until August 24, 2023.

2023-24 Winter

The 2023-24 Winter hiring process ran from August 2023 to September 2023, involving 19 DRPS members.

- YIP received 473 applications and conducted 139 interviews
- YIP employed 94 youth, including 80 Students, 8 Team Leaders, 4 Supervising Team Leaders, and 2 Program Coordinators.
- Employment began on November 22, 2023, with Students working 10 hours per week until March 27, 2024.


Program Demographics

YIP is proud to employ youth from diverse backgrounds across the region. Gender and Identity

Candidates could identify as female, fluid, male, nonbinary, transgender, two-spirited, not specified above, and/or prefer not to answer. Of Student hires:

- 53.39% responded Female
- 1.27% responded Fluid
- 42.91% responded Male
- 1.22% responded Non-Binary
- 1.22% preferred not to answer and/or indicated not specified above.

Candidates could identify as Asian, East Asian, South Asian, Black, Indigenous, Latin/Hispanic, Middle Eastern, White not specified above, and/or prefer not to answer.






- 3.81% responded Asexual

- 13.90% preferred not to answer and/or indicated not specified above.










Below is a comparison of Student Canditates versus Hires from the 2020 Summer Initiative to the present (inclusive).



MAJOR PROJECT AND EVENTS

Newcomer Soccer Tournament (Summer 2023)

Partnering with the Community Development Council Durham, YIP hosted their newcomer soccer tournament to strengthen connections between our YIP students, and youth who are new to Canada.

- There were over 30 participants who attended between the ages of 14-24.
- Throughout the day, YIP students and newcomer youth got together to enhance their skills, contribute in teambuilding activities, and participate in various games of soccer.
- YIP students demonstrated leadership while outlining the importance of inclusion, diversity, and healthy living.

Basketball Tournament for Special Olympics (Winter 2023-24)

The Basketball Tournament intended to connect YIP students with Special Olympic athletes to create positive relationships through sports.



MAJOR PROJECT AND EVENTS

Wellness Event (Summer 2023 and Winter 2023-24)

A brand new event for the YIP program which was first introduced in Summer 2023 to help promote positive mental health for YIP students.

- YIP students participated in rotations throughout the day to practice positive mental health in a collaborative setting.
- Notable activities include participating in an active boot camp, mindful meditation, pet therapy, and creating DRPS wellness packages, which were provided to officers (was to at RHQ).

C.A.N. Conference (Summer 2023 and Winter 2023-24)

The CAN Conference creates opportunities for YIP Students and Alumni beyond the program through Community, Advocacy, and Networking.

- These conferences highlighted the importance of community involvement and engagement. Youth learned how to become ambassador's change through the breadth of opportunities provided at YIP and across the Durham Region.
- CAN was opened to the public in which **over 400 youth** from across the Durham Region attended and engaged with **over 50 booths** over the course of the two conferences, allowing them to network with volunteer, employment, and support organizations.

Coldest Night of the Year Fundraiser (Winter 2023-24)

The Coldest Night of the Year is a national event and fundraiser aimed to give participants an insight into homelessness in Canada and have a comprehensive understanding on how to create change in a team oriented way. This year, YIP partnered with North House to better support homelessness within rural and northern areas of Durham Region.

- A grand total of \$16,282.23 was fundraised by YIP members over the course of the Winter.




